

Treasurer's Report— \$374.35

Forest Hills Plan

- Addendum to First Addition Plan
- Result of more than a year of work, including study groups, presentations to neighbors, survey, etc...
- Each section of the plan includes policies just for First Addition, policies for both areas, and policies just for Forest Hills.
- Highlights:
 - Traffic recommendations
 - Reduce cut through on C Ave and Bayberry from Country Club by installing median island to reduce length of left turn lane at intersection with Iron Mountain.
 - Improve parking on Andrews in front of the school.
 - Streetscapes
 - Prefer unique small homes set back from the street, arranged side by side rather than flag lots.
- Path forward:
 - Plan will go to Planning Commission in August at the earliest.
 - In July a notice will go to all households in First Addition and Forest Hills about an open house and opportunities to testify before the Planning Commission and City Council.
- Adoption of Forest Hills plan as addendum to First Addition Plan – vote carried with no opposition.

Infill Task Force II

- Neighborhood representatives on the taskforce are Jim Bolland and Brad Beals.
- Topics include: sideyard setbacks, sloped lots, extending design review to single family houses.
- Overlay zoning is best way to address issues that vary from neighborhood to neighborhood; one size does not fit all.
 - “Overlay” modifies the underlying zone.

Tenth Street Green Street

- July start date.
- May not be finished until summer 2008.

Stop Sign Project

- First phase will start soon – installing 22 new stop signs at 12 intersection sites.
- Second phase will involve removables of some stop signs.
- End result will be stop signs at every other intersection, both east-west and north-south.

Alley Cleanup Days

- Main issues are overhanging branches, plant material, etc...

Lake Oswego to Portland Transit and Trail Study

- Between 1985 and 2005 there were 800 accidents on Hwy 43 and Macadam; of those 90% involved injuries.
- Options eliminated so far: river transit; widening of Hwy 43/Macadam; reversible lane on Hwy 43.
- Options still on the table: streetcar; bus rapid transit; bike trail.
- Committee will make its recommendations in June – this is only the first step.
- Next step – steering committee of elected officials, including Clackamas County Commissioner Lynn Peterson.
