

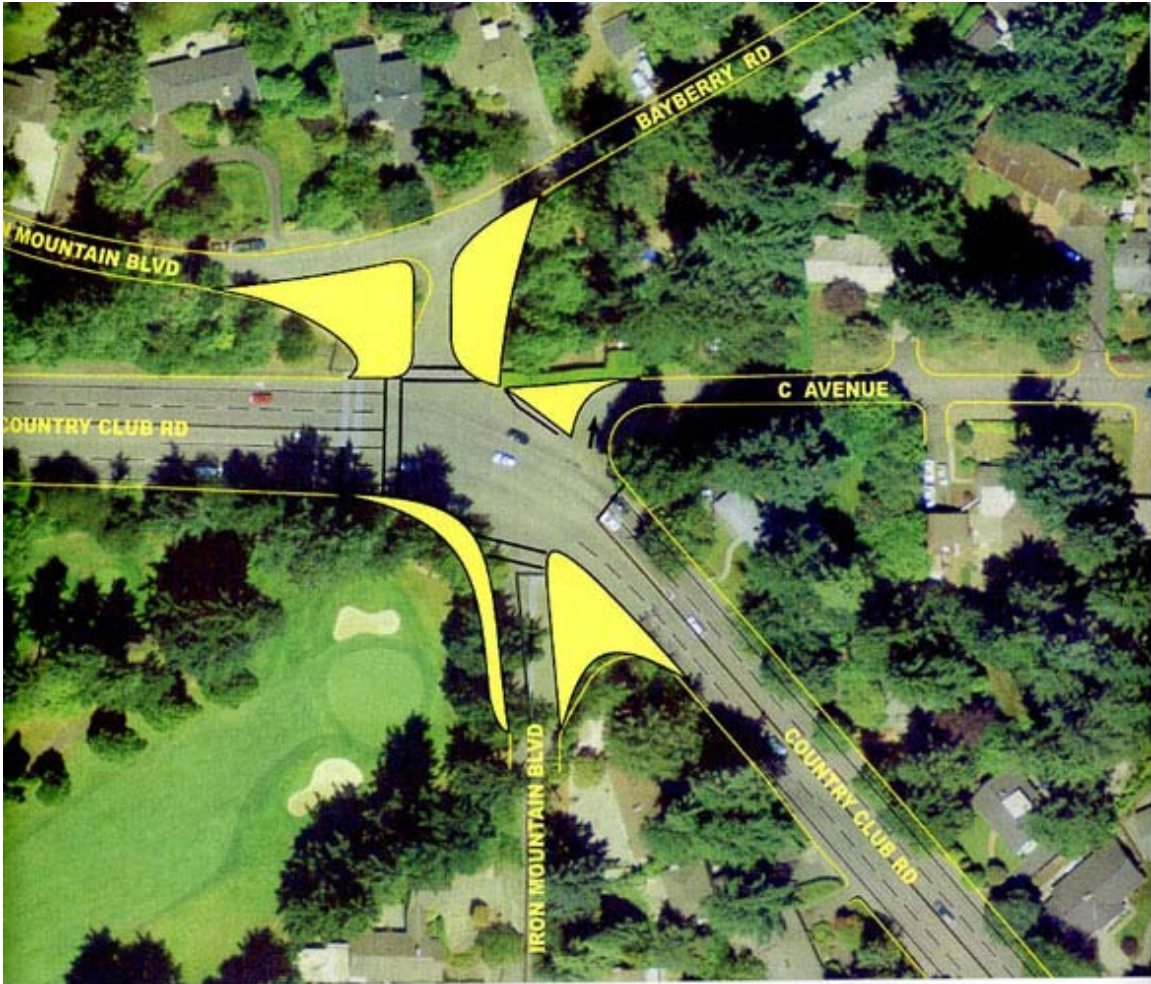
FAN/Forest Hills Coordinating Committee Meeting October 7, 2009

Meeting called to order by Chair Maria Meneghin.

Mayor Jack Hoffman stopped by and took a few questions about the cost of engineering for the bank plaza park and City Council work sessions.

Six Corners

- Maria was approached by 2 City staffers regarding this intersection.
- More than just our neighborhood is impacted.
- Low rate of accidents so low priority.
- Air quality issues resulting from traffic back ups are more of a concern.
- Reasons given by City staff that it is not a good candidate for traffic circle:
 - Topography – not flat
 - Need to encroach on sensitive lands
 - Street configuration – some streets entering the intersection are too close together
- City staff ideas for improving the intersection focus on limiting C Avenue access and joining Iron Mountain/Bayberry access.
- Also suggested shortening left turn lane on Country Club coming down hill towards town – would do this only if other recommended changes were made.
- Among those in attendance there was little support for these ideas; general sentiment that traffic circle would be a better solution.
- Maria and Jim Bolland recommend that Six Corners be addressed in the 2010 Transportation Plan and not in our neighborhood plan.



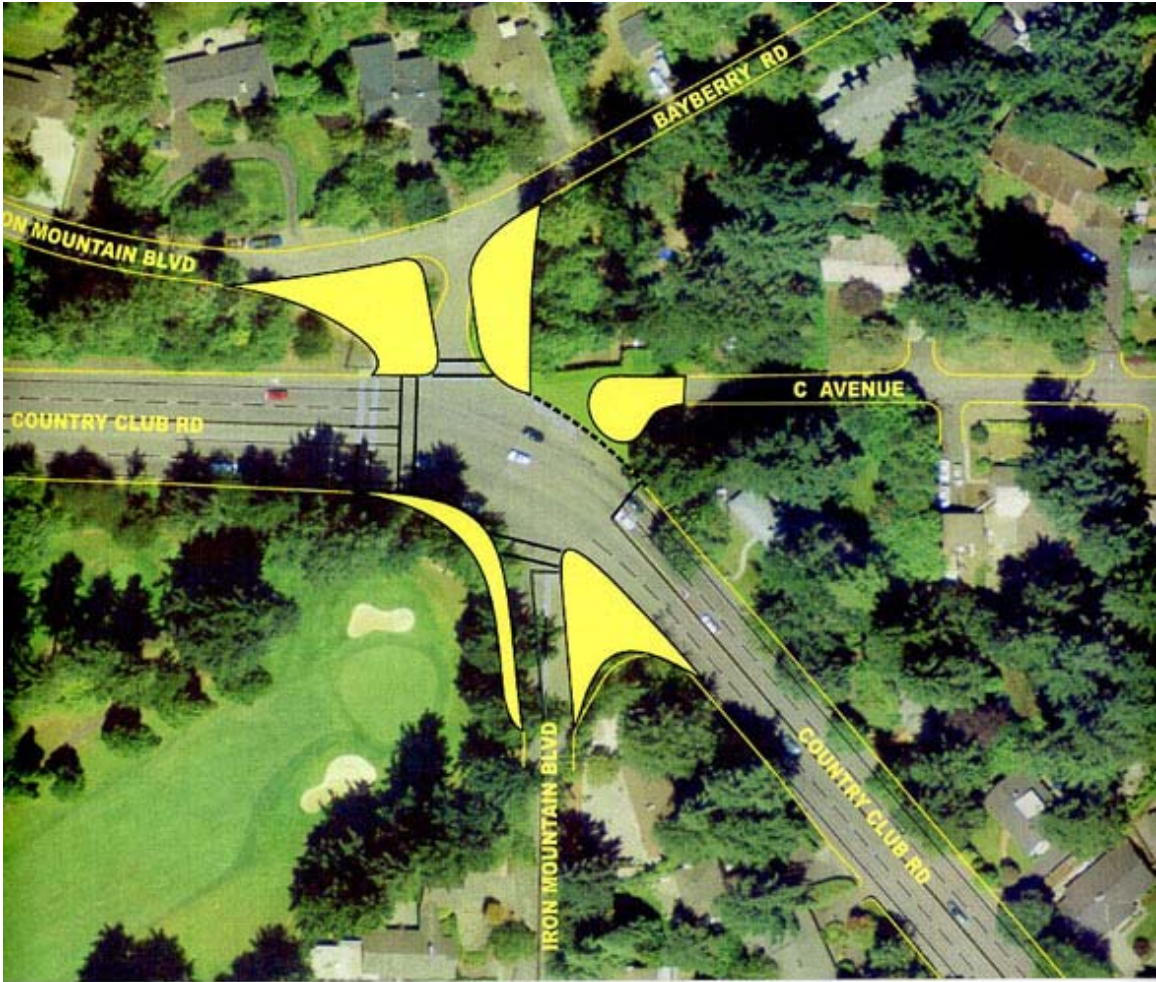

Entrance Only at C Avenue



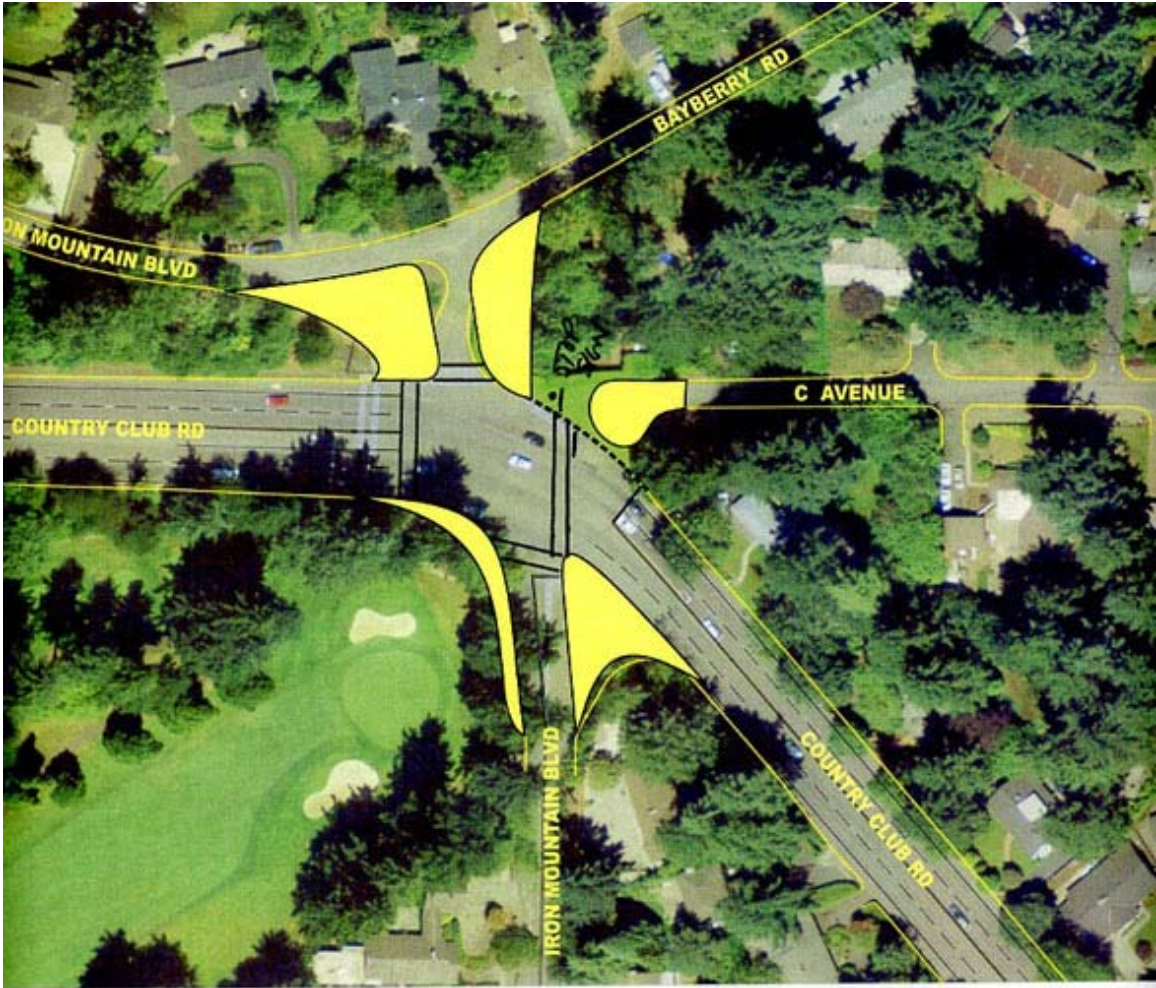

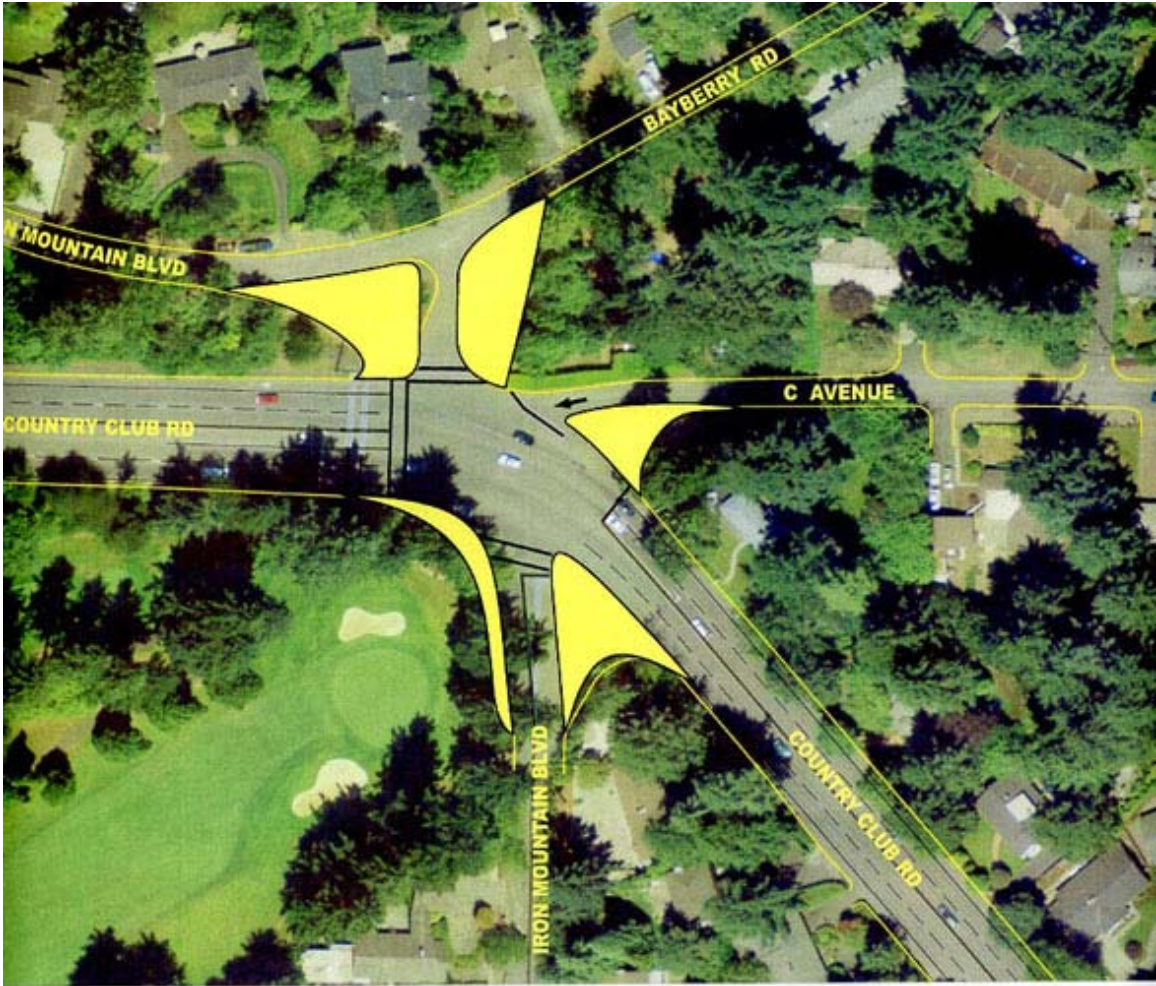

Capital Improvement Plan (CIP)

- Recommendations for projects to include are due by October 26
- Ideas discussed from the FAN/Forest Hills Neighborhood Plan that would be recommended as priorities include:
 - Addressing endemic surface water problems in First Addition
 - E Avenue Pathway
 - C Avenue Bike Boulevard

Streetcar

- Draft Environmental Impact Study is next step
- Dave Jorling named to committee as FAN/Forest Hills representative
- October 2010 will be another opportunity for public comment

Sensitive Lands

- Second look committee includes Andy Harris (FAN resident and past Vice Chair), among others.

City Council

- Stafford Triangle:
 - Not that much developable land (much land already designated as wetlands, habitat, etc...), most likely to be developed by Wankers Corner and I-205.
 - Metro and Clackamas County have slightly different takes on it.
- October 27 work session about lot coverage changes for schools. Hearing is scheduled for December 1.

Infill

- Still in Planning Committee
- Addressing sloped lots and design review

Tree Committee

- Swartz development at 567 Sixth – tree cutting permit was denied for a second time
